## Wisdom

Those of you who have access to BBC IPlayer may well have seen the half hour cartoon over Christmas called "The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse". This is an animation of the book by the same name by Charlie Mackesy which has become a best seller. It has much wisdom which appeals to all generations.


Wisdom, as shown in this book, is often quite simple but incredibly profound. As the lectionary gospel readings are taking us on a journey with Jesus this January, they are showing this everyday simple wisdom of Jesus as he begins his ministry:

- he said to his disciples "let's go somewhere else" when he was swamped by people.
- he arranges a boat to preach from so he doesn't get crushed by the crowd.
- he tells his family and accusers stories to try and help them understand him.
- he goes off for walks and prays outside away from the synagogue with its distractions and those who oppose him.

Jesus also uses animals to illustrate wisdom or speak of wisdom, e.g.

**"be wise as serpents  
and innocent  
as doves"**

There is so much we can learn from looking at the nature of God's creatures, the way they live and move.



Looking back over 2022, the decisions and judgments you made, I wonder if all would be classed as wise. If not, what went wrong? Are there behaviours and attitudes that need to be unlearned.

The following simple, wise prayer is prayed by many today:

**God, grant me  
the serenity  
to accept the things  
I cannot change,  
the courage to change  
the things I can,  
and the wisdom  
to know the difference.**


