## For all that has been, thanks; for all that shall be, yes.

Over these past few weeks, the Diocese has been marking its Golden Jubilee Anniversary. Two special services were held in London: a Eucharist at All Hallows by the Tower on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> January and a Choral Mattins at St Clement Danes, the Central Church of the Royal Air Force, on the Strand the following day, Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> January. Each service was distinctive in character and drew different congregations to come and celebrate fifty remarkable years.

These services were followed eight days later by the opening Eucharist of the Synod in St Christopher's Cathedral Bahrain, another wonderful 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration.

The Synod itself was a very positive event held in the Gulf Hotel. The team at St Christopher's



Cathedral, under the leadership of David Axtell and in liaison with Dr Helen Perry and the Diocesan team provided a wonderfully

varied programme, which included a Gala Dinner hosted by *This is Bahrain* (an interfaith initiative in the Kingdom), the Chrism Eucharist at Awali Church followed by dinner in the BAPCO Club, and an interfaith service at sea in several dhows. The keynote speaker was Martha Jarvis, the Anglican Communion's Permanent representative to the United Nations, who gave three challenging addresses inspired by the theme of Jubilee. The community of St Paul's Nicosia and wider Diocese was delighted to hear the news of the appointment of the Rev'd Canon Dr Walter Brownridge as the new Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, Nicosia. Walter and his wife Tina know the Cathedral community, having served as a locum priest last year. He comes to St Paul's with a breadth of pastoral and academic experience, having served in the Diocese of Vermont both in parish ministry, as a Cathedral Dean, and as Associate Dean at the School of Theology of Sewanee, University of the South, Tennessee.

It was a joy to hear the appointment of the Rev'd Navina Thompson to St Helena's, Larnaca. No stranger to the Diocese Navina is returning from London, where she has been serving as




associate rector at St Mary Norwood Green and as a bank hospital chaplain at London Northwest University Trust. She has previously served in Cyprus as assistant priest in the parish of Ammochostos and student chaplain for St Mark Famagusta.

She and her husband, the Rev'd Canon Andy Thompson, also served for many years in St Paul's Kuwait and St Andrew's Abu Dhabi, where he was parish priest.

## Placement in the Diocese

She is an artist and photographer and teaches art and is Head of Photography at Victoria College in Jersey. ## Farewell Deborah

The Rev'd Deborah Moorgas' first experience of the Diocese was as a locum priest in St Christopher's Cathedral Bahrain, when she



was continuing to work in marine insurance. The experience of pastoral ministry in the Diocese encouraged her to apply for the vacancy at St Barnabas' Limassol. She has reflected a deep humanity in her ministry and a willingness to speak out, when impelled to do so. She has seen St Barnabas' flourish under her leadership and contributed to the life of the Diocese, especially through co-ordinating the Retreats Ministry. We thank her for all she has given and wish her well as she returns to South Africa after Easter.

## Rest in Peace

We were saddened to receive the news of the death of the second Bishop of the Diocese, Bishop Harry Moore, on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2025. Bishop Harry died at the grand age of 102. His funeral took place in Middleton, Manchester on 30<sup>th</sup> December 2025

In the Church Times, Canon Mark Oxbrow, who served with him in CMS, wrote: *"He will be remembered by many as a man of practical Christian faith and service, a down-to-earth northerner with a great store of spiritual wisdom."*

Bishop Harry's family have given his pectoral cross and his vestments to the Diocese.

We also heard the sad news of the death of Irene Jeynes, wife of the Rev'd Tony Jeynes. Tony was Chaplain in Kyrenia from 2004-2007, before he and Irene moved to Paphos.

Irene and Tony had spent time in Cyprus recently; her funeral took place, on Thursday January 22nd at 11:30am at Holy Trinity Church Southport.
