Chrism Eucharist and Renewal of Vows

Wednesday 4 February 2026 at 1800, Awali Church (gold/white)

The focus of the service this morning is the renewal of Ordination Vows and the Blessing of the Oils.

It is the occasion in the year when the Bishop leads the people and clergy of the Diocese in a renewal of their ordination and baptismal promises to dedicate themselves to the service of Christ and his people.

In accordance with ancient practice this Eucharist is also the occasion on which the Bishop blesses the oils to be used in ministry during the coming year.

The Oil of the Sick: this is blessed to be used, following the example of the apostles and the teaching of St James, in the Church's ministry to the sick and dying.

The Oil of Baptism: this oil, sometimes called the oil of the catechumens, is used to prepare those who are to be baptised. It is a sign of the grace of God leading them and strengthening their wills in his service.

The Oil of Chrism: this oil is the sign of the anointing of the Holy Spirit. Those who are baptised and confirmed are marked with the sign of the cross, symbolising their place in the royal and prophetic priesthood of Christ's Body.

Sermon

Affirmation of Vows

My brothers and sisters, at his Last Supper, our Lord Jesus Christ gave his disciples a new commandment, that they should love one another, and he prayed that they might be one. He gave them an everlasting sign of his own love, in the sacrament of bread and wine. He consecrated himself to his Father's service, to be the high priest of the New Covenant.

I invite you now to dedicate yourselves afresh to his service.

The Bishops STAND as Canon Chris Butt addresses them:

Will you continue as faithful stewards of the mysteries of God, preaching the Gospel of Christ and ministering his holy sacraments?

The priests reply,

By the help of God, I will.

They remain standing. The Bishop invites the deacons to STAND and says,

At your ordination as a deacon, you received the yoke of Christ, who came not to be served but to serve. Will you continue faithfully in this ministry, to build up God's people in his truth, and serve them in his name?

The deacons and priests reply,

By the help of God, I will.

They remain standing. The Bishop invites the Readers, together with the licensed and authorised lay ministers, to STAND and says,

When you were commissioned, you undertook to be faithful in prayer, and by word and example to minister to those for whom Christ died. Will you do all that is in your power to witness to God's love for his people?

The Readers and the licensed and authorised lay ministers reply,

By the help of God, I will.

They remain standing. The Bishop invites all others to STAND, and says,

The Church is the body of Christ and to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. Will you work together with one another and your ministers to promote the body's growth in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, that we may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called us out of darkness into his marvellous light?

They reply,

By the help of God, we will.

Will you as the clergy and people of the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf accept the discipline of this Church and reverently obey your Bishop and other ministers set over you in the Lord, gladly accepting their pastoral direction and leadership?

All reply,

By the help of God, we will.

My brothers and sisters, let us pray for one another: Each a precious child of God and valued member of his mystical Body on earth. May our Heavenly Father fill us with the fullness of his love, so that by Christlike service we may be a sign of his love for the world; That by his Holy Spirit we may be a sign of his victory over sin and brokenness, That by his irrepressible life, we may be a sign of abundant living welling up to eternal life.

Amen.
